

# Prisoners of War

## **785000 Henry Jones**

Originally enlisted with the 129th Battalion and went overseas as part of the Bartonville Detail. Jones joined the 60<sup>th</sup> Battalion on December 6, 1916 as part of a reinforcing draft from the 124<sup>th</sup> Battalion. He was transferred to the 87<sup>th</sup> on breakup of the 60<sup>th</sup> Battalion. On the 15<sup>th</sup> of August 1917 he was reported missing. On September 5, 1917 it was reported that he had died from wounds to his left leg below the knee on August 16, 1917 while a Prisoner of War being held at Feldlaz, Oignies, France a town just northeast of Lens. Thirty year old Henry Jones is buried in Cabaret Rouge British Cemetery, Souchez, France. He is commemorated on the honour roll of the 87<sup>th</sup> Battalion.
