

60th Canadian Battalion (M.R.C.) Operation Order 77

14

December 23rd 1916.

Ref. Map, ROCLINCOURT, 1/10,000.

(1). In accordance with orders from the 9th Can. Inf. Bde., (O.O.64), the 52nd and 58th Canadian Battalions will relieve the 60th Canadian Battalion in G.Ls Sub-section, night of 24/25th December, and the 60th Can. Bn., will proceed to Divisional Reserve at ~~BRAY~~.

(2). Companies will move independently.

(3). Advance parties, one N.C.O. and two batmen per Company will report at Battalion Orderly Room at 11 a.m., Cooks will clean up their cookhouses and take dixies to MAISON BLANCHE, reporting there by 6.15 p.m. to march out.

(4). Lewis guns will be taken from MAISON BLANCHE by transport.

(5). Baggage must be at MAISON BLANCHE by 8 p.m.

(6). Receipts for trench stores and certificates as to cleanliness and sanitary condition of dugouts will be taken from relieving units.

(7). REPORTS.

Companies will report commencement of relief by Signal message regardless of clock hour, A Coy. "12/15", B Coy. "3/5", C Coy. "6/10", D Coy. "12/5", Completion of relief by A Coy. "6/7", B Coy. "6/10", C Coy. "3/5", D Coy. "6/3". All companies will report on arrival at ~~BRAY~~ and arms will be examined there before dismissing.
