October 27th 1916.

October 15th 1916. Battalion remained at BERNEVILLE. Church Parades held. Weather, cloudy, Clear at night. October 16th 1916. Battalion paraded at 9.20 a.m. and marched to BOISBERGUES, Via MONTRELET, FIENVILLERS, AUTCHEUX. Weather fine. Osteber 17th 1916. At BOISBERGURS. Battalion Inspection by Commanding Officer. Training, drill, bombing, Lewis Gunnery. Weather edoudy .. October 18th 1916. At BOISBERGUES. Continued Braining. Weather unsettled. Oetober 19th 1916. . At BOISBERGUES. Continued Training. Weather unsettled. October 20th 1916. Battalion paraded at-11.00 a.m. and marched to BONNIERES via LA MEILLARD-FROMEN-FROMEN-LE-PETIT, FROMEN-LE-GRAND, VILLERS-LE-MOPITAL, arrived at 2.45 p.m. Weather fine and cool. October 21st 1916. Frest during the night of the 21st. Battalion paraded at 8.40 a.m., and marched to MAGNI COURT-SUR-CANCHE via FREVENT, HOUTEN HOUVIGNEUL, arriving at 12.30 p.m. Brigade Conference of Commanding Officers at HOUVIN at 5.00 p.m. The G.O.C. explained conditions in new area in which Brigade was to take position. hop October 22nd 1916. Advance party of Officers tisited 179th Brigade Headquarters at ECOIVERS and Headquarters of the 2/16th LONDON REGIMENT at MAISON BLANCHE. The Battalion parades at 11.00 a.m. and marched to WAVILLERS-BRULIN via PENIN and TINQUES, arriving at 3.00 p.m. The Commanding Officer returned to duty. Weather, fine and cool. Ostober 23rd 1916. ' Battalien paraded at 1.30 p.m. and marched to MAROEUIL via SAVY and ETRUN, arriving at 5.15 p.m. Company Commanders and Battalion Sergeant-Major went in advance, to visit new area. Weather aloudy. October 24th 1916. At MAROEUIL. Men got baths and clean underwear. Proceeded with relief of 2/16th London Regiment, Signallers and Lewis Gunners starting in the afternoon, balance of Battalion and Readquarters moved off from MAROEUIL at 3.00 p.m. Relief completed at 11.50 p.m., Headquarters at MAISON BLANCHE, two Companies in close support and two Companies in Reserve on right and Left Sub-sectors of Centre Seater, respectively. October 25th 1916. Enemy Treach Mortar fire fairly active. Practically no artillery or rifle fire. Men used as carrying parties for rations and water, and work parties for upkeep of trenches. Weather unsettled. October 26th 1916. Quiet day. Inemy fired a few shells on rear area. Weather cloudy.
