- (I). In accordance with orders from the 9th Can. Inf. Bde., 0.0. No. 68, the 52nd Canadian Battalion will relieve the 60th Can. Bn. in thenches C.I. Sub-section, THELUS SECTION, night of January 17/18th. One Company of the 58th Canadian Battalion will relieve "D" Coy. 60th., in the Left Support.
- (2) On relief, the 60th Canadian Battalion will proceed to Divisional Reserve at BRAY.
- (3). Advance party of 1 N.C.O. and two batmen per Company will report at Battalion Orderly Room at 11 a.m., January 17th., for further instructions.
- (4) Lieut. Brown will take charge of the Advance Party and take over for Headquarters.
- (5) Lewis Gums will be taken from MAISON BLANCHE by transport and Corporal Skuce will be held responsible that all gums are accounted for and loaded on the transport before it is allowed to start back to BRAY.
 - (6) Baggage must be at MAISON BLANCHE by & pum.
- (9) Dugonts and cookhouses must be left absolutely clean and sanitary and receipt will be obtained from the incoming unit to this effect.
- (8). Trench stores, including rubber boots and lumbermens socks will be handed over and receipts obtained as usual.
- (9) Cooks will have their cook houses cleaned and carry dixies to MASSON BLANCHE, reporting there not later than 6.15 p.m. to march out.
- (10) On arrival at BRAY, all arms will be examined, care being taken to see that no cartridges are in either breach or magazine.
- (II) Commpanies will report completion of relief by code message *12/17* and will report to the Orderly Room on arrival at BRAY also.
